- Free membership and regular email updates /

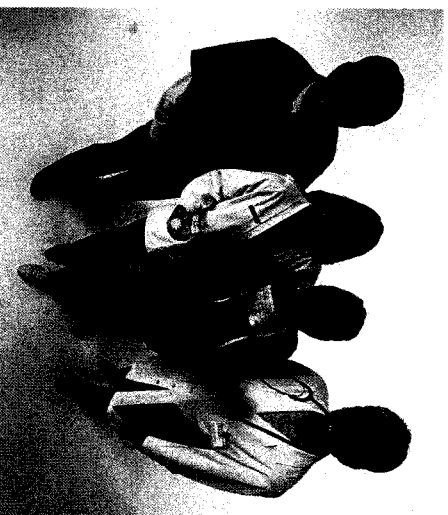
Mission Statement
